## About Our October and November Golf

This is a bumper edition with 2 tournaments and a competition to be reported, two of which are part of our Autumn signature tournaments:

- 🌐 The Peter Dawson Bowl
- 🌐 The TRISOC competition
- 🌐 The Rankin Brothers and Sons Trophy

## Summary

- 🌐 A bumper turnout for the Peter Dawson Bowl of 52 players saw Mark Dawson himself haul in the Peter Dawson Bowl with 36 Stableford Net points (29 Stableford Gross), winning on the back nine against Håkan Karlen and Alistair Ferguson.
- 🌐 RBCGS won the TRISOC competition this year with 253 points versus 243 for Tagus and 235 to PINGS. Teresa Negrão brought in a fantastic 37 Stableford Net points
- 🌐 The Rankin Brothers and Son Trophy, played in a tornado at the Lisbon Sports Club for a change of scenery and a forward to the past event, saw 24 golfers out of 43 hold-out against the winds and rain and finish the course. While the trophy was not awarded, Steve Deighton drew on his inner health hacks and won with 37 Stableford Net points (13 Stableford Gross), while Dhru Thapa used all the remedial qualities of the herbs and spices he grows in his garden to bring in 23 Stableford Gross points and ignore the rain.

## The Peter Dawson Bowl

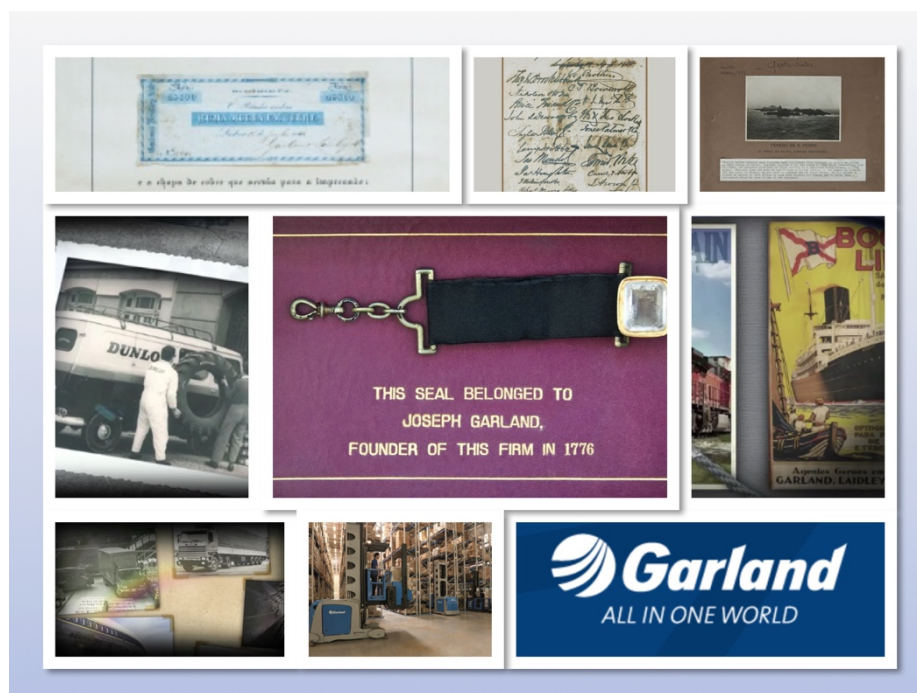

### A Bit of Background

The Peter Dawson Bowl is generously sponsored by the Garland Group, a company set up in Portugal in 1776 by Thomas Garland. With a presence in the market of *four years short of a quarter of a millennium*, Garland is one of Portugal's oldest companies. Since its foundation, the company has developed and morphed its strategic business lines from printing bank notes in 1848 to becoming a key navigation agency in Portuguese waters in 1855, through to transportation businesses by rail, air and sea through much of the 20th Century culminating in today's strategic focus, under three divisions, of



Logistics, Transport and Shipping. With 5 offices in Portugal, 2 in Spain and 1 in Morocco, Garland provides today, a complete supply chain management solution for its customers as well as transport solutions to and from the Iberian Peninsula and Morocco.



The first Peter Dawson Bowl was played in 1982 and is one of the RBCGS's longest running competitions, launching our signature autumn golf series. On behalf of the RBCGS, I extend our sincerest appreciation to Mark, Mané, Bruce, Giles and the Dawson family for their long-standing support through Garland of this competition. We were equally privileged to have all of them join us for the competition and for Mané to have joined me and Håkan to hand out the prizes.

### **The Tournament**

The competition saw an extraordinary 52 registrations for golf and 56 for lunch. We were able to fill all 14 tee-offs designated to the tournament, which exceptionally, thanks to the approval of Plage S.A. started with two tee-offs from the 17<sup>th</sup> hole to get people back in time.

### **The Results**

#### ***Top Performer Prizes***

Mark Dawson was clearly motivated to get the Bowl to do a pit stop again in his trophy cabinet and stepped out with the talent and guile to bring it back home – and he did with 36 points, winning on the back nine from Håkan who, from the numbers dropped his guard on the 17<sup>th</sup> hole and picked up and Alistair, who despite 7 Stableford Net Birdies released the throttle a bit too much and delivered a couple of uncharacteristic pick-ups. In 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> place, we had Fernando, Gerard, Ron and Sakiko all with 34 points, with their order coming from the last 6 or last nine holes.

Following a bit of after lunch auditing the Newstead, which was awarded to Sakiko, now goes to Tereza who is yet to receive her award.

### ***The Individual Skill Performances***

### ***The Birdie Performance***

Seven birdies were scored in the tournament with Ron delivering one of them off the challenging 12<sup>th</sup> hole and Camille managed to open her game with a birdie on the 1<sup>st</sup>. No new players breached the 5 birdie mark leaving Dhru on 13, Alistair on 6 and John Philips on 5. John received his award this time.

### ***Scorecard Performance***

How were the scorecards for the tournament. Great! But we did in our haste to get the results in, get caught by scores in the wrong column. We did manage to halve the input times by having the Gross score clearly written into the 1<sup>st</sup> column for the player and the 5<sup>th</sup> column for the marker and signed off properly. Thank-you all for helping here.

## **Lunch**

After the competition, 56 players, partners and spouses enjoyed a supreme of pork in the restaurant leading up to the prize giving which saw Mané Dawson on behalf of Garland work with Håkan and myself to get the prizes to you all.

## The TRISOC Competition

### History

The TRISOC competition has been played since 1996 between TAGUS, PINGS and RBCGS. In that time, PINGS has won the competition with 14 wins, followed by RBCGS with 6 and TAGUS and the 2021 holders, with 5. This was the fourth and last of our inter-society competitions after the Chatham Trophy, The Beret and Bowler Competition and the Barmen of Portugal Trophy.

## Getting a Team Together

12 players play from each society. The format of the TRISOC is based on all 12 players from each society playing for their individual Stableford scores and then aggregating the best 8 scores to determine the winning team. Each tee-off includes a player from each of the 3 teams.

The competition was planned for the 28<sup>th</sup> September, but PINGS needed a change of date and we were able to land on the 26<sup>th</sup> October, because the Rankin Brothers and Sons Trophy also needed a date change.

The art of management is to keep your eyes focussed on the task at hand but also to ensure one's peripheral vision sees what's going on in the distance. Back in May, I had just changed out my specs and had them changed to sunglasses, which obscured what I needed to be prepared for 3 months ahead. Infact, I was still catching my breath from the RBCGS Platinum Jubilee event, when I heard that Camille was already on manoeuvres to recruit her Tagus team in early June.

My only course of action was: "Panic".

I zapped off a few emails to a few players whose performance statistics looked good from the RBCGS year's results to date, only to receive replies that as of 30 mins earlier they were Tagus players. Ouch!! and well-done Camille for your organisation.

## The Teams

Thankfully, RBCGS has enormous depth, enthusiasm, and commitment in its players. Despite the rolling date and near tournament Covid turbulence, we fielded a balanced, diverse, and motivated team including myself, David Gray, Ron Goddard, Keith Potter, Sally Buxton, Julie Brown, Steve Deighton, Ian Yarwood, Sakiko Takeda, Hans Ludolphi, Jan van Boetzelaer and Teresa Negrão.

In line with the tradition, the captains go out first and then the flights are built around lowest to highest handicaps.

But there was still emotion to be had before we got to the golf course. When exchanging our team lists, PINGS was fielding a team with an average playing handicap of 11.5, TAGUS of 17.1 and RBCGS of 20.8. This can be read however you wish.

## Results

### Team Stableford Results

The competition was not a slam dunk for any of the teams. There was much nail biting to the last flight.

PINGS took the lead after the first two flights, before Ron and Keith brought RBCGS into the lead, a position we held onto until Flight 9. Then Andrew Jones took TAGUS into the lead with a solid 34 score. At that point, Hans, Jan and Tereza brought RBCGS back into a strong lead by the end of the match. The results were:

RBCGS came out first with 253 points, Tagus was second with 243 points and PINGS came in 3<sup>rd</sup> with 235 points – so we are now at the halfway mark. But PINGS are resolutely determined to get it back soon and have offered to run the tournament on a Stableford Gross basis. Clearly we have not agreed.

## Rankin Brothers And Sons' Trophy

### A Bit of Background

The RB&S TROPHY is generously sponsored by RANKIN BROTHERS AND SONS, a company synonymous with cork since 1774. Since 1855, the Company has grown, traded and continued to work with the drinks industry to provide cork stoppers for bottles.

The first RANKIN BROTHERS AND SONS TROPHY was played in 1997 and is the second of our signature autumn golf series. Our sincerest thanks goes to Ewan Rankin of Rankin Brothers and Sons for his very generous sponsorship and stewardship of this signature event.

### Lisbon Sports Club

This year the RBCGS went forward to the past and played the Rankin Brothers and Sons Trophy at an away venue – the Lisbon Sports Club. In the past some of the tournaments, particularly the Rankin Brothers and Sons and the Peter Dawson Bowl were played away, with Quinta do Peru and Aroeira Pines Classic featuring as away venues.

We took the tournament away this year because we needed to move the tournament to November from October, and Plage SA were not forthcoming with a new date. RBCGS worked closely with the sponsor Ewan and Rankin Brothers and Sons to get an exciting opportunity up in the hills of Belas as the Lisbon Sports Club





### ***A bit of History about the Lisbon Sports Club***

During the early years of the 20th century, it was known as the “Clube Inglês da Ajuda”, but the sporting history of Lisbon Sports Club dates back to 1861. On the 17th and 18th of October of that year, the first cricket match between a team from the unvanquished city (Porto) and a team from the capital was played. The northern Englishmen traveled by horse and boat, down the coast, on a long and adventurous journey to Lisbon. The game was played in what is now the Campo Pequeno Bullring and marked the official start of the Lisbon Cricket Club.

In 1873 the list of members of the club was made up almost exclusively of Englishmen, but some Portuguese families stood out among British sportsmen. In those years, the sport was not yet a valued activity by the Portuguese.

Between its early days and 1922, the club brought other sporting activities into its fold, with football, athletics, tennis and golf all finding a place amongst its members. With this growth of scope, the club changed its name from the Lisbon Cricket Club to the Lisbon Sports Club in 1922. In parallel, as Lisbon grew, the Lisbon Sports Club moved its base from Campo Pequeno, to Cruz Quebrada, Ajuda and finally settled in Serra da Carregueira in Belas.

### **The Tournament**

The tournament saw another fantastic sign-up with 43 registrations for golf and 46 for lunch, filling 13 of the 14 tee-offs agreed with Lisbon Sport Club.

#### ***The Weather***

The forecast for the tournament was rough. Over the previous week it had gone from a little - to a lot - to a little – to none – to some rain. On the day there was a chance that we would be save rain until 13:30 before a fly-over by Niagara Falls. Brollies and rain gear were brought in preparation for a new type of golf story to be created.

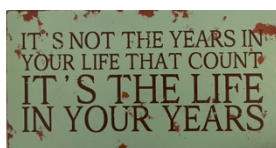
#### ***Wild Boars***

To add to the narrative, wild boars were nearby in the woodlands, and had had a feast on some of the fairways and prepared them to plant potatoes. We did note a few hunters up behind the course in the likely hiding places for the boars and off course a few shots rang out from time to time.

### **The Results**

The tournament started well in relatively dry conditions, sunny spells and wisps of cloud around. By 12:00 Iguacu Falls had flown over with a chant of “Get me out of here” ringing from the buggies of some of the flights. Others, knowing that the Niagara Falls was next on the menu, took to the wet conditions like ducks to water, especially Rudiger and Per who were in the last flight and took all the water and no sun.

24 players completed the course, with the remaining players taking to the comfort of an open log fire in the club house and a drink to warm them up or satiate their thirst. As lunch progressed and after few decision u-turns by the captain, we decided to award the prizes for the tournament but not the trophy. Many thanks go to Ewan for bearing with me on this and joining me to award the prizes for the tournament which was a rowdy event.



### ***Top Performer Prizes***

Steve Deighton put in the leading performance of the tournament with 37 points through a real soaking. Kjelle, 36 points, Ewan himself on 33 points and Dhru on 30 points came in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> respectively. They did catch the front end of Iguacu falls but missed Niagara Falls. To close out the prizes we then had Mark and Camille bringing in 30 points each, but Camille was clearly affected by the downpours in her last 9. Finally, Andre took away the Newstead prize. No Cowbell was awarded.

While the trophy was not awarded, the results have been integrated into the end of year Order of Merit results (see later).

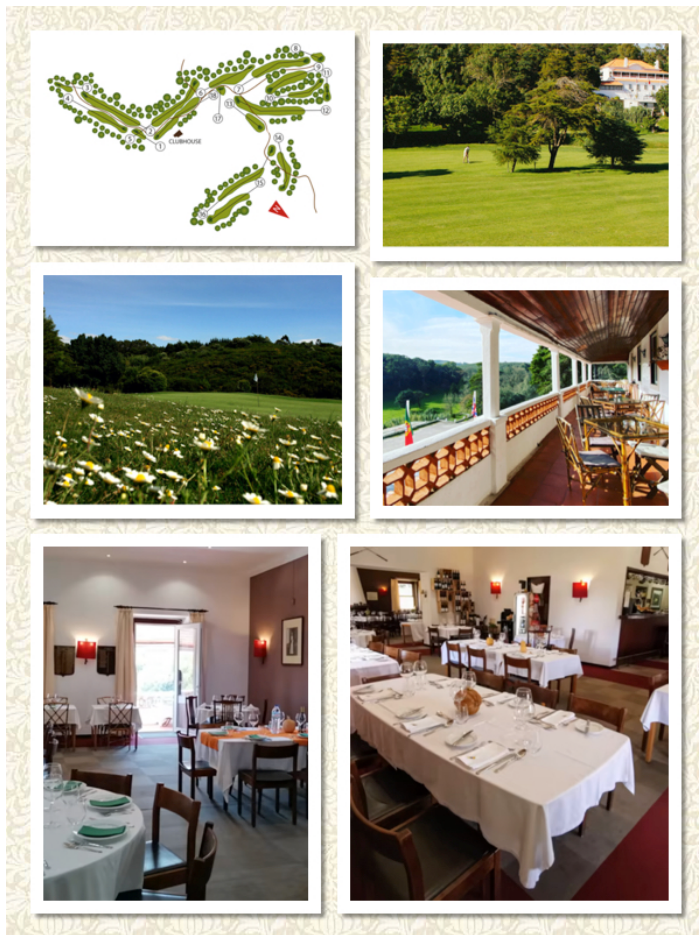
